



One Session Plan

Information for logon	<p>Email instructions to students, or, write up on the whiteboard if in a group session / computer lab scenario.</p> <p>Login = www.bulls-eye.careers/login (NZ) www.bulls-eye.careers/login (AU)</p> <p>Username/email + password combination to login.</p>
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Once logged in, students need to click on the 'let's get started button' near the top righthand side of page:



Post Bulls-Eye Activity	<p>Use the <u>explore your results</u> worksheet (click on the link below) to encourage research in to a career path of interest.</p> <p>http://www.bulls-eye.co.nz/assets/Exploring_Your_Results.pdf</p> <p>NB: this worksheet is also available as an interactive pdf or google doc.</p> <p><i>This 2-page (one double-sided) document is an interactive pdf which has been designed to be used electronically. With your set up in the computer lab, I would recommend simply printing out a stack of these and handing it out to the boys. Once they complete the quizzes, they can work their way through the worksheet and hand in at the end to you.</i></p> <p><u>One key instruction: get them to name the form!</u></p> <p>NB: students can repeat this activity for a number of different pathways if they have several they wish to explore.</p>
Preparation: Account List	<p>Print a copy of the <u>account list</u> to have with you at the sessions as this has a record of all email addresses and passwords. That way you can refer to the list if anyone has trouble logging in.</p> <p>NB: you will have previously provided us with email addresses and passwords for your students and we will have used these to set up individual student accounts.</p>
